

PRESS RELEASE August 11, 2020

Mayor Harry Gutheil announced today that the Village of South Glens Falls will be starting construction work this week on its estimated \$3,600,000 water upgrade project that is funded in part, through a \$1,620,000 WIIA grant, a \$919,560 CDBG grant and an Environmental Facilities Corporation Drinking Water Loan. Work includes rehabilitating its one million gallon water tower, installing carbon filtration and replacing water mains on Haviland and on Wilson Avenue between Prospect Street and Main Street. Work will continue through the month of November. During the time the water storage tank is off-line and all Village water customers are encouraged to conserve water use. Interruption in water service is not anticipated and customers are asked to call Village Hall, if they have any questions.

The Village also has a sewer project ongoing. 10,000 feet of sewer line has been inspected by closed circuit TV. The project includes repairing, replacing or lining sewer mains, repairing manholes and upgrading and rehabilitating the pump station. Some repairs have been started and some of the contracts awarded. The project is estimated at \$2,000,000 and the Village has a \$500,000 grant and is eligible for zero interest financing.
