Public Forum 7:00 pm: John Hoey had a question about the Junior High on Hudson Street and the Harrison Ave school. He asked why we do not have flashing lights to warn there are schools located there. He stated that we are the only community that does not have this. He wants this to be looked into for the safety of the kids. Mayor Bodkin asked TJ to look into this with the Chief. He also stated there is a section of Gansevoort Rd and he asked why there were no signs stating the speed. TJ stated that this is a state road and is not the responsibility of the village.

1. WIIA Water Project:

- a. Water Tank Update: The water tank is all set and no updates at this time. Trustee Gutheil stated that we raised the liability limits for the project itself. He stated that we would have to discuss if we want to go back to the limits that we have prior to the construction and all of the people working on the tank. Trustee Gutheil thinks that we should talk to our agent about the limits to decide what to do. This will be added to the next agenda.
- b. Carbon Filtration Project Bid Proposals and analysis: An email was sent



yesterday at 3:45 PM with two attachments. One was the overall budget analysis and one was the water upgrade bid and rebid. We have a final price for that project. There is no confidential information so all figures are allowed to be discussed but any other information regarding who to award the bid to should be discussed in an executive session. The water treatment plant upgrade will be the sum of three numbers. Two contracts general and electrical and the direct purchase from the vendor for the granular activated carbon media. \$200,000 dollars for the granular. The lower bidder for electrical is \$78,000 and the lower bidder for general is \$1,544,500.00. The total is \$1,823,000 for the water treatment plant upgrade. This does not include engineering fees. The overall engineering fees for three projects is \$272,000. This does not include the rebid fee of \$10,800. There is a spreadsheet available that breaks everything down. There is going to be an annual user rate increase of \$63.37. Trustee Gutheil asked how much over budget we are on the projects. For the sewer grant, we are \$400,000 under budget. For the water project, we are \$295,000 under budget. The water tank and PFOA came in \$761,000 over budget. The bids aren't what we had hoped for but we should not wager on seeing the prices coming down. Mayor Bodkin had asked if we should reapply for another grant to address the carbon filtration needs. Anthony states that could be an option but he does not think that is something that would happen soon. He does not think the contractors are going to want to bid three times on the project. He would have to consult with Robert to see if there is a way to put a hold on the recent bids. He does not think we would be able to do that because of the lead times for materials. Anthony can not tell what the chances would be at us being able to get another grant. Trustee Gutheil said that we are incurring a tremendous amount of debt. He thinks that we need to take a second look at whether we should be doing our own water. He thinks that we should look into regionalizing and analyze if there is a better deal out there. We also need a cost-benefit analysis. He believes that we need to assess all of our options. He just thinks we need to take a hard look at it and make sure we are doing the right thing for the community. A decision will be tabled until the next meeting. Anthony needs to know exactly what he needs to look into. This can be followed up on an email.

WIIA Sewer Project:

a. Sewer i&i Update: They received the part they have been waiting on and they are looking to put us on schedule. They are hoping to follow up on that soon. The requirements have not changed, so we are just waiting on the schedule. Trustee Gutheil asked if everything is still good with our contract times. Anthony stated that we could change the times at the end of the project. Anthony will follow up to make sure the bonds and insurance are still in place.

2. CDBG Project:

Project closed out update- Everything is in compliance and no further questions or comments. The only thing that needs to be discussed is whether or not everything has been paid and if we are seeking reimbursement.

3. GIGP Update- Update:

a. Adjusted Budget amount to 1.2 million: From looking at the projections we can lower this from 2 million. We should amend the budgeted amount. It can be amended again and will not affect the grant. Trustee Gutheil would like a breakdown on how we came to the amount of 1.2 million. Anthony can provide a spreadsheet to the village to review to show how we arrived at this number. The



- board would like to wait until we can get more information before approving the budget. This will be discussed at the next meeting.
- b. Where do we currently stand for GIGP?: There are no updates at this point. Anthony would like to know when the village would be interested in proceeding with bids. The village would like to proceed with bids in February.
- 4. CDBG Baker Ave, Grant Application- Breakdown once notice is given by CDBG: Anthony does not have the information. He reached out to CDBG for the information but they have a policy where they won't speak to engineers without the clients involved in the email or phone call. A phone call with CDBG will need to be arranged.

5. New Business:

- A. Schedule future meetings for 6:00 to allow for Executive Session prior to the regular meeting time of 7:00, discussion: This will allow more time for things to be talked about. The board supports this. Motion# 152022-1 to amend the regularly scheduled meetings to begin at 6 PM for executive session and 7 PM for open session on the first and third Wednesday of each month. Trustee Carota moves, and Trustee Girard seconds. All in favor. Motion Passes.
- B. Job opening for Deputy Clerk Treasurer: All interested candidates should apply on indeed.com or direct their resumes to Mayor Bodkin at mayor@sqfnv.com

Part Time Police Officers Wanted- Please direct any interested candidates to Chief Gifford.

- C. Trustee Gutheil brought up the Arbor Day Grant. We would be able to have an Arbor Day celebration if we can get this grant. The Mayor would need to sign this application. This could be prepared by Trustee Gutheil and TJ and be on the agenda for the next meeting. The majority of the board is favorable to this grant. Motion 152022-2 to authorize the pursuit of the arbor grant and authorize the Mayor to sign the application once prepared. Trustee Gutheil motions, Trustee Gutheil seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.
- D. Trustee Guthell would like to know if the Board would like to do an RFP this year for the insurance so that the insurance committee can look into this to see what we did previously. We want to make sure we are doing things competitively. Trustee Carota will help get more information on this.
- E. There are some Covid test kids available. They were handing them out at Town Hall. It would be good for us to have a supply at the Village office. The Mayor reached out to the Town Supervisor via text prior to Christmas to see if the village could receive any. He followed up and was told that the test kits were reserved for the schools and he has not heard anything else. The Mayor will follow up on this again.
- F. Trustee Gutheil stated that we should make sure the website is up to date when it comes to the meeting minutes.

6. Old Business:

- A. Please welcome our new staff member Samantha Berg, Senior Account Clerk Typist. Her first day working with the Village was 1-3-2022.
- B. Please welcome Lisa Soifer as our Office Temp. Lisa will work as needed until a Deputy Clerk Treasurer is appointed/or as needed.
- C. Please welcome James Woods as our new Building/Code Enforcement Officer overseeing all planning and zoning matters 25 hours a week and James will be working in the water department 15 hours a week. Full time hours will begin late January, until then he will be working PT.
- D. We will no longer be needing LA Group's services. The Mayor will inform Jim Martin of this.
- E. Trustee Gutheil states we have a fire company contract and we may be required to have a public hearing on that contract. When that is ready to go together, Attorney Bartkowski can advise us on that. We should just keep an eye out for the contract.
- F. Trustee Gutheil wants to find out something about our bridge lights. The utility company should be notified of this.
- G. Trustee Gutheil states that we also need a date for a parade committee meeting and a police meeting. Trustee Orlow will need to get some information on this.
- H. Trustee Gutheil states that we need monthly financials and year-end from last fiscal year. We need these in our hands and department heads would need these as well in order to complete their budget request.

- 12. Quickbooks Update: Payroll has been completed. Everything went as planned. A couple tweaks and it is perfect. The only other thing that needs to be put in is the beginning balance of January 1st on the banks. This will be used to reconcile the banks. No engagement letter from the CPA. They are working on the proposal package for us. They require certain documentation. The proposal package should come soon.
- 13. Copier issues/proposal: The copier is not working properly. They replaced a part free of charge but it stopped working again today. It is just old and worn out so Joy gave information on what we can get. It is a refurbished machine and it is just one flat fee where everything is included and we would not have to pay any extra copies or anything. This would save us money in the long run. Trustee Gutheil would like to see the numbers



and see what the arrangement is with the vendor that we have now. Would also like to find out if there is something like this on a state contract. Our current vendor is unable to give us new machines and the wait time on state contract machines is very far out. Motion 152022-7 that we approve the new machine based on counsel's review. - 21. Shared Services DPW: There may be times where the Town and Village will need support from each other. Creating an agreement between the town and village would be a good idea when it comes to DPW services. We will find out if there is any interest within other municipalities.

Public Hearing 7:00 Wilson and Haviland Avenue CDBG Project: Had penciled in a public hearing but unfortunately, we can not conduct this hearing because we did not have enough time for it to be noticed. Motion 01192022-3 to schedule a new public hearing on Wednesday, February 2nd. Trustee Orlow Motions. Trustee Gutheil seconds. All in favor, Motion passes.

Public Forum 7:02 pm: Bob Orway has a question about the water meters that are being installed. His question is why is it necessary to incur this expense and not just leave everything the way it is? Did we put an RFP out to engineers to put in a design for the carbon filter system? What product did they specify and did we go out for bids on that? He also asked if we had looked into DE filtration rather than carbon filtration. He stated that this kind of filtration would be cost saving. The Mayor stated that we are doing the water project



because we received a grant and are only responsible for paying 25% of the cost. This will enhance water conservation efforts. This will also help to correct the fee structure that is currently in place. This will also lead to less water shortages and will put less water restrictions on users throughout the year. Our current contract limits the amount of water we can purchase if we did need water if the village was to run low. We have trace amounts of PFOA and PFOS in our drinking water and the carbon filtration system will filter these out of the water. Delaware Engineering gave the lowest bid so that is why we went with them.

1. WIIA Water Project:

A. Water Tank Update: None

B. Carbon Filtration Project Bid Proposals and analysis- Delaware Engineering sent a proposal to the Village for the alternatives that were looked at. They are waiting for a response on that. The Village has requested an extension on the bids until we get approval from the DOH. Anthony will ask the lowest bidder if they would be willing to give an extension on their bid. Trustee Gutheil believes that this is a major expense and needs to be looked into more before we make a final decision.

C. Sewer I&I Update, KPI. None

2. CDBG Project: Project close out update, Delaware Engineering does not have the final approval yet but they have everything submitted.

3. GIGP Update, Update:

- a. Adjust Budget amount to 1,2 million- Trustee Gutheil believes that this budget is still high. Trustee Girard also thinks that we can come lower. The Mayor chose 1.2 million so that we would have a cushion to utilize the full amount of the grant money. In order to utilize the full grant the budget would have to be 1.33 million. Trustee Gutheil believes that there are other options out there that we need to look into. There was discussion with Anthony and the Mayor that this is the budget that we would need to have for the project so Trustee Gutheil is ok with amending the budget.
 - Motion 01192022-4 to amend the budget to 1.2 million Trustee moves to amend the budget to 1.2 million. Trustee Orlow seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.
- b. Where do we currently stand?- They are ready to go to bid on this project at the Village's convenience.
 - Trustee Gutheil asked if we are committing to doing the AMI system. Anthony stated that this was discussed back in June or July of 2021. The Board agreed that the AMI was the way to go with the project. If we wanted to do something else, paperwork would have to be done and approved.
 - Trustee Gutheil thinks that we are headed down the wrong path and need to look into something else and will not be supporting it.
- 4. CDBG Baker Ave, Grant Application: Anthony has not received any word from CDBG. A phone call will need to be done to discuss the denial once they have the letter.

5. New Business:

A. Job opening for Deputy Clerk Treasurer: All interested candidates should apply on

- B. Part Time Police Officers Wanted: Please reach out to Chief Gifford
- C. Trustee Gutheil would like to make a motion that we make it a policy of the Village Board that if two board members want to call a special meeting of the Village Board, they can. The Mayor stated that he believes we have to follow NYCOM procedures in regards to calling meetings. In order to take action we have to look Into this further to make sure that doing this is legal. This will be tabled until counsel can review and advise the Board.

6. Old Business:

- A. **Bridge Lighting:** The Mayor has gone to different sources to find out information in the past. The quote he had received was for all of the lighting in the village. He reached out for a quote for just the bridge lighting and has not yet received a response.
- B. Trustee Gutheil stated that he is getting financials without some of the revenues listed. He would like to know what our reserves are and what the water and sewer amounts are. He stated that he would also need to know what our fund balances are
- C. Trustee Gutheil got an email that we now have the auditors contract that was dated December 17th. He is wondering what happened with that. He stated that there is also an SLFRP program where we might be able to get some funding from. The Mayor asked Trustee Gutheil to forward this to the Board.

Discussion: Trustee Gutheil stated that we are going over our budget on some of these items and he would like a print out of all three accounts to see what we are going to do for the next three months.



- Motion 11922-5 to approve the transfers. Trustee Carota moves, Trustee Girard seconds. All in favor except for Trustee Gutheil. Motion passes.
- 8. Approve Bills: Motion 11922-6 to approve the bills as audited. Trustee Orlow moves. Trustee Girard seconds. Trustee Gutheil stated that he believes that vouchers were added to the last warrant between when they were added and when they were approved. He believes that the chromebooks and microphones were added and paid for and if this did happen he wants it on record that he did not approve this and that this being paid was not done properly. All in favor except for Trustee Gutheil, Motion passes.
- 9. Magna 5 / Verizon State Contract Discussion: The Mayor reached out to Verizon for pricing. He has not heard back and will follow up once more.
- 10. RFP for Trash services and IT Services: There will be an increase in fees for IT services. The Mayor would like the board to consider RFP for the IT Services and trash services. Trustee Girard believes that we should also do an RFP for engineering. Trustee Gutheil would like to look further into cleaning for the firehouse. Motion 11922-7 to approve this. Trustee Girard motions. Trustee Orlow seconds. All in favor. Motlon passes.
- 11. Water Penalty Refunds: This has been discussed in depth with counsel. The credit that anyone should receive will be noted on the next water/sewer bill.
- 12. Holiday Pole Lights on sale 33% off: This is the time of year when they offer the biggest discount. The Mayor wants to see where the board is on the purchase of additional pole lights. Trustee Glrard would say yes to this. We should be able to put out some new ones every year. Trustee Orlow supports this as well. Trustee Guthell is not opposed to buying some but how many would we get and he asked how much we have in the budget for it. Trustee Gutheil believes that we should look at the budget before we do anything.
- 13. Quickbooks Update: Joy was not on the call.
- 14. Copier update: We have reviewed the old copier agreement and the new copier agreements. Attorney Bartkowski wanted some clarification from them so the Village knows exactly what machine they are buying and the year of the machine. They are ready to bring in the new machine. We would be leasing the machine and there is an option to purchase at the end of the lease.
- 15. **Update of local laws:** There is a worksheet that we have been contributing to over the last several months. There are a few items we need to visit.
- A. Overnight Parking: This does not specify the December 1st through March 1st enforcement period that we all thought was there so this is one local law that the Board should consider amending.
- B. Updating our code to include stop signs at Brentwood and Woodcrest: The Board



- supports this.
- C. Putting a 15 mph speed zone around our local park: The board supports this. We have to make sure that this is being enforced if we do approve this. It is a village street so we would be able to do this.
- D. Roadside Trash: We need to put a local law that allows a person to put something out for 3 days and on the 4th day they would have 24 hours to remove the item or the village will take it for a charge. Board supports this. Trustee Carota has asked if there is a way for us to just eliminate people from putting things on the side of the road. We could put a penalty in place for anyone who violates this. The Mayor has asked Attorney Bartkowski to come up with a few different variations when she drafts up the law,
- E. **Nuisance Law:** Updating this to be more stringent and encompass more challenges. Stronger code provision would go a long way for future things. Board supports this. Trustee Girard says that we should go to a point system.
- F. Creating a law to prohibit engine brake use: There have been a lot of complaints about the engine brake use. The Board supports creating a law to prohibit this.
- G. Parking Tickets: Tiered parking ticket system is what we were using. This system is not really working and there has been some pushback from the court. The mayor thinks that there should be a straight parking ticket fee instead of a tiered system.
- H. Upgrade our code to include materials other than copper: The cost of copper just keeps increasing and other materials would be more cost effective. * Make this one a priority to change.
- I. Update our water code: Definitely needs to be done if we are going to have meters.
- 16. FOIL Appeals Officer: We have never appointed an official appeals officer. It is most commonly the mayor that is the appeals officer. Motion #11922-8 to appoint the Mayor as the appeals office. Trustee Carota moves. Trustee Girard seconds. All In favor except for Trustee Orlow and Trustee Gutheil. Motion passes.
- 17. Northline Utility Request: They would like to utilize some property behind St.Michaels to store some equipment for 3 months. The board approves of using the old contract that was in place when this was done previously. Attorney Bartkowski can send this information to TJ so that he can look it over and let Northline know what they would need to do.
 - Motion 11922- 9 to authorize the Mayor to sign the Northline utility contract to lease the space for the period and terms in the contract as presented. Trustee Gutheil motions. Trustee Orlow seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.
- 18. DPW Truck Request, F550 truck request: TJ stated that this was in his budget for this year and was approved. The truck we are replacing is failing. It is a 2004. The funds for this purchase would be coming from chips funds. The total amount is \$71,475. Motion 11922-10 to approve the purchase of the F550 truck. Trustee Orlow motions. Trustee

Public Forum 7:00 p.m: No one from the public wishes to address the Board at this time.

- 1. Delaware Engineering Report on Items:
 - a. Carbon Filtration Project Update: Anthony Mantas stated the contractors are excavating the water treatment plant. No complications at this point.
 - b. Sewer I&I Update: The current failed manhole lines were relined in February. Anthony stated there has been no complications since then. Legal counsel is going to draft a letter to request an annual inspection. This will be done when the secondary review is complete. On October 26th, Anthony did not permit the contractor do a straight forward pavement restoration. They instead installed a flowable fill. This extended the operation an extra day to the 27th. There will be an inspection of this project to confirm the void is not being recreated. Once the inspection is done, we can move forward with paving. Anthony does not have clear direction from DOT, he would like to prepare for possible investigation on the pipe between the two manholes.



c. GIGP Update (Water Meters): On October 26th the bids were opened and we received three. Anthony noticed several issues with these bids and notified the Board. Anthony was unable to compare bids due to these issues. There was a typo for a quantity on our bid invitation. One bidder added a line item to separate a cost for yoke and komerhorn. He stated we can not guarantee quantities on line items. Anthony requested these items to be included with the meters. The other two bidders did follow these guidelines. This makes the bids unequal and Anthony can not make a recommendation. Anthony can update the bid within a day. Trustee Gutheil asked if we can replace all the end points ourselves. TJ said it depends on the system. Trustee Gutheil asked about the cost after five years with the systems. Anthony stated there will be maintenance costs with either system, but it is difficult to predict the amount. Trustee Gutheil believes the previous counsel did not review the original invitation to bid. The Mayor stated she was given the documents to review but did not provide documentation for comments or feedback. Trustee Gutheil would like current counsel to review and provide documentation of their findings.

Discussion: Trustee Gutheil stated he has no problems with the December minutes. Trustee Gutheil asked if we are going to number the pages. Trustee Gutheil would like his opinion on what money was not invested more detailed. Trustee Gutheil believes four million dollars was not invested. Clerk Treasurer Berg stated she believes the minutes are accurate. Trustee Gutheil believes the October minutes distorts the actual situation we are in. Motion #110222-8 to update Zoning and Planning Board fees by \$100 to cover for any administrative fees. Trustee Carota motions. Trustee Orlow seconds. Trustee Gutheil no. Rest in favor. Motion passes.

Trustee Girard would like the 2019 fee schedule to be updated. The Office noticed Zoning and Planning Board fees are low compared to the expenses incurred. The Mayor would like to add a administrative fee to cover postage and advertisement.

8. Village Signs: TJ stated the material is aluminum with vinyl wrapping. DPW will be responsible for installing the sign. TJ recommends going with West Signs regardless of their price. They are a more reputable business and TJ has seen their work before.
